## Compliance Corner - Fall Prevention

An important aspect of patient safety is reducing patient falls and CMC has a strong initiative with regard to fall prevention in hospitalized patients. Safety contracts have been established for patients deemed to be at risk for falls. These contracts are a cooperative effort between staff, patients and families to help keep their loved one safe. A Patient Education Instruction Sheet has also been developed that provides patient and their families with guidelines that delineate what the patient/family can do to prevent falls, what the role of staff will be, and also includes fall prevention strategies to use in the home upon discharge. As healthcare providers, our directives include:

- Falls assessment and application of a yellow "falls risk" band for patients who are fall risks
- Application of the yellow star outside the room of a patient deemed to be a fall risk
- Frequent rounding and tracking of rounding with the electronic call bell system, assessing toileting needs, change of position, pain level
- Keep personal items and the call light within in reach
- Quick response to calls for help
- Maintaining beds in a low, locked position with bedrails up as needed
- Encourage the use of assistive devices for stability i.e.: cane, walker
- Have patients sit before standing, and stand before walking
- Use of non-skid socks or slippers
- Orient/reorient the patient as necessary
- Keep the room free of clutter, and clean spills immediately

The initiatives in use at CMC have shown a reduction in patient falls. It takes effort to maintain safety, but compliance with these initiatives has shown positive outcomes.

The male carpenter bee tends to be solitary.
